The course will develop students' intercultural competence, including the development of an understanding of cultural values, beliefs, and norms, as well as developing empathy and the ability to see things from others' perspectives.

Information for Virtual Exchange Students (partner institutions)

Students enrolling this class as part of UNLA's Virtual Exchange Program must be nominated by their Academic Mobility Coordinator and must send via email, the following documents on PDF:

- 1. Copy of current School ID
- 2. Copy of passport or any other official ID
- 3. Transcript of records (not necessarily in English)
- 4. English Language Proficiency Certificate (TOEFL, Duolingo, Cambridge, TOEIC, etc), if not available, a letter in English issued by the home university can be accepted.

Once all the documents are sent, the candidate will receive the **Course Request Form**, that needs to be filled out and sent to: movilidad@unla.edu.mx.

Certificate & Transcript of Records

Students who successfully complete the course and pass all the evaluations will receive a **certificate of participation** that states that you took a subject in English. For Virtual Exchange Students, in addition, you will receive an **official transcript of records** that you can use to validate a subject in your home institution*
